
Happy Happenings

O The Wonderful Cross

"In the Cross of Christ I Glory"

Although we do not generally identify with losers, the One who lost His life on the Cross accomplished what no human could ever have done: made atonement for our fallenness and our rebellious nature. In other words, our sin. His act of ultimate self-giving paid a price, served as an example, and satisfied a Divine inclination to reclaim the high ground from the forces of evil. While the empty tomb of Easter morning stirs our hearts and hope, our redemption was won-cosmically, indescribably-on a post fitted into a socket on a hill designed to provoke terror: Golgotha, the hill of execution.

While this is counter-intuitive to a culture that celebrates winners, it is another expression of what theologian Donald Kraybill called "the upside down kingdom": the first shall be last and the last shall be first; those who lose their lives for the sake of the kingdom shall win new life.

Simone Weil, the mid-20th century French political activist and philosopher, found her agnosticism overcome by a mystical experience of Christ, while visiting the chapel of St. Francis of Assisi in Italy. Her conversion from Judaism and agnosticism spoke to many:

What I call heaven, as you know, is the Cross. If it cannot be given to me to deserve one day to share the Cross of Christ, at least may I share that of the good thief. Of all the beings other than Christ of whom the Gospel tells us, the good thief is by far the one I most envy. To have been at the side of Christ and in the same state during the crucifixion seems to me a far more enviable privilege than to be at the right hand of his glory. (from Waiting for God)

In these last days of Lent take time to consider anew all that God accomplished for us, in the Cross of Christ. *Pastor Steve* Page 6
