

The Treasure We Are

Author Eugene Peterson wrote:

A friend told me this story. He was teaching a group of young people the parables of Jesus. They were reading together the kingdom parables of the treasure in the field and the pearl of great price (Matthew 13:44-46). He asked them what exactly they thought this 'treasure' and this 'pearl' was. They responded readily, but also, as is the style of young people, noisily. One girl had not spoken. The teacher asked her, 'And Brenda, what do you think this means?' In a quiet voice, and with considerable shyness, she said, 'I am the pearl of great price.' The tenor of the discussion immediately changed. Reflections turned inwards as they considered the kingdom within them-the treasure that was them-that the farmer and the merchant sold all that they had to buy. And yes, that Jesus had sacrificed all that he was and bought-me.*

The way to access the presence of God is to look inward rather than outward. We incarnate-put flesh on-Christ when we respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit by loving, feeding, clothing, visiting, healing, and being present to the least of these. Our doing for Christ should be a result of our being with Christ and with his people. Jesus said, "Where two or more are gathering in my name, there I am in the midst of them (Matthew 18:20).

May we continue to gather the treasure that is *us* as the body of Christ, committed to witnessing the hope of Christ to our corner of the world.


