

you might hum along with on the radio... brings you comfort when you are sad... you share with a special someone...

Music holds a special place for us because it cues our emotions and may even move our bodies. Even if we don't think of ourselves as "musical," each of us has the capacity to make music in one way or another, by humming, singing, playing an instrument, or even by drumming our fingers.




